THE GOLD MINER, THE SCOTSMAN AND THE PROMISE OF RIVERVIEW

At Treefest this year Val Adolph will tell the story of how Henry Esson Young and John Davidson united to create the Provincial Mental Hospital and its Lands at the site now known as Riverview. She will cover the concepts of dealing with mentally ill people at that time, and how these concepts have changed, contrasting this with the constancy of the healing power of a beautiful natural environment – for everyone, not just the mentally ill. Come and hear Ms. Adolph relate her first-hand experience and observations at Riverview. There will be time for questions after her presentation at 1:00 pm in the Henry Esson Young building.

Val Adolph is a retired Riverview employee and a founding member of the Riverview Horticultural Centre Society. She is an award-winning speaker, historian and author who has been involved in the publishing of 12 non-fiction books.

BONSAI ART EXHIBIT and DEMONSTRATION

Ken Baker has been practicing the Art of Bonsai for 23 years. He has a background in professional photography, is a certified Horticulturalist with extensive working background in the field and for many years was a full time practicing arborist. This knowledge has been an asset in learning the art of bonsai but certainly not a necessity.

Anyone with a creative muscle and a greenish thumb and of course the desire to learn will discover a new and wonderful world of miniature within themselves bursting to come out. Ken's talk/demonstration will include the basics of bonsai art, such as how to effectively work and trim roots, best soil choices, best pruning techniques for bonsai, wiring/training basics, best stock choices for bonsai, necessary tools, etc. etc.

Fall 2008



We were pleased to have so many members and friends show up for our Annual General Meeting in June. Thank You to everyone who came out to support us.

Just in time for our AGM the Society received a mini-documentary called For the future of Riverview. The 8 minute film produced by the City of Coquitlam and coordinated by Mariette Pilon includes still photos of Riverview's picturesque settings, important archival material and short interviews with historians and some of our own Society members. The project was initiated by Coquitlam Council's Riverview Task Force in late 2006 and includes an excellent 4 page brochure making this something new and exciting that we can take out to the community. We need to carry on - raising awareness by 'telling our story'.

There are times when we all wonder how long it will take. We still get asked, "Are we allowed on the ground?" "Are any of these buildings actually habitable?" and "What's so special about these trees?" Of course the answer to the first two questions is YES and re: the tree collection- "One of the finest in Canada."

We point out that no one knows what our future needs will be regarding mental health and that we must work harder to preserve the remaining 244 acres of this asylum setting. With what we read and what we see when we walk down some of the streets in Vancouver or even walk the Coquitlam river it seems as if the needs will be great indeed!
