On Monday November 26th members of RHCS and BMN set off for Victoria, to witness Coquitlam/Maillardville MLA Diane Thorne and Port Coquitlam MLA Mike Farnworth, **present "almost 11,000" petitions to the Legislature.** 

This is the last week of the fall session, and it was deemed necessary to get the petition tabled, before any public debate sessions start to happen in the spring.

Diane told us that they will continue to accept signed petitions until April, so please keep encouraging your friends and neighbours, and strangers you "chat up" while on your rounds.

Also do go online, and sign the petition, you can make your own comments. There are already some very interesting remarks. See page 3.



Still time to sign both petitions - Paper & Online!!




Have you seen our ad campaign in the Tricity Newspapers? RHCS ran a weekly ad for the past 9 weeks. We will continue after the holidays are over.


"The Riverview task force got it right, and spoke for all of us. Please follow thier advice. The alternative would be devastating." -KL Port Coquitlam

With our successful Treefest well behind us one would think that things would slow down but the RHCS executive has been very busy with meetings, getting petitions signed, putting a paid ad together for the local papers, reviewing reports, manning displays, re-designing our website, and more meetings. The Stewardship Committee has started on a process which will assess and document the Natural Areas of the Riverview site.

On Nov. 28 I attended a meeting of the BC Schizophrenia Society, North Shore Branch, at Lions Gate Hospital in North Van. Several people in this group are also members of the Riverview Preservation Society. MLA Diane Thorne and Mayor Maxine Wilson were guest speakers. Many at this meeting are very much in favour of re-establishing institutional-type treatment programs at Riverview as they feel that is the only environment that will help their family members. I'm sure you have heard all kinds of talk about establishing a Homeless Shelter at Riverview but we don't know anything more about that than what we read in the papers.

We have been told by ARES at a Stewardship Committee meeting that the public meetings re the future of the Riverview Lands may start in January. If this happens, we will certainly get the information out to our members. Meanwhile keep those petitions coming.

**Directions:** To reach HEY building take Holly Drive through the hospital grounds, then go uphill on Oak Crescent, and the HEY is on your right on Kalmia Drive. Find parking, and meet at the front door. Buses do go through the grounds, ask to be let off above Crease Clinic.

**Information:** Walks are usually led by a volunteer arborist, and last about two hours, depending on weather and walkers' preference. Dress for the weather, and wear comfy shoes or boots. We go rain or shine. Children are always welcome. Dogs must be on 'leash'.

Walks are free but you can join the society, or make a tax-deductible donation if you wish.
